## **MINUTES**

## 1. CALL TO ORDER – Randy Hodges at 6:07 PM

#### 2. ACTION ITEMS:

Review and discussion of the 2022-2023 General Fund and Water & Sewer Fund Budgets and proposed property tax rate for 2023.

The General Fund, Water & Sewer Budget packages and a proposed property tax calculation summary sheet were provided to council for review. The current tax rate is 0.511 per \$100 valuation. Tax rates proposed for consideration were identified as 0.471, 0.472, and 0.473 per \$100 valuation. Cody Wommack asked if the city had considered adopting a 3-2-1 discount option for tax payments. This allows a three percent discount to citizens if the taxes are paid within the first month after tax statements are mailed and reduces a percent each month thereafter until the end of January. This option had not been considered and was asked to be placed on the agenda for the next City Council meeting. Discussions continued about what tax rate to propose to county so a public hearing and meeting could be scheduled and published in the local newspaper.

A motion to propose a 0.473 tax rate to county to assess taxes and prepare notices for publication was made by Rudy Dudley, with a second from Jerri Chism. Two voted for, and one voted against.

A motion to adjourn was made by Cody Womack with a second from Jerri Chism. Two voted for; one voted against.
