Who We Are?

The purpose of the Lone Star EDC is to encompass and complete projects benefiting and the public purposes of the Citizens and City of Lone Star. The Lone Star EDC is a State of Texas Class “B” funded EDC and any and all expenditures must meet the criteria defined under “Purpose” within this newsletter. All EDC projects must be approved by the EDC and presented to the Lone Star City Council for approval.

FUTURE PROJECTS

Grant submitted to relocate the existing basketball court at city park and create a new modern well lighted court for youth of all ages.
Replace and install a new covered pavilion.
Install a lighted covered pavilion by the boat ramp for multi-function use.
Install a new park in the Edgemont area of Lone Star to provide a safe environment for all ages including, but not limited to, playground equipment, picnic tables, and a lighted basketball court with safety fencing around the areas.

PURPOSE

The Lone Star Economic Development Council (EDC) is organized exclusively for the purpose of benefiting and completing the public purposes of the citizens and City of Lone Star as outlined below and may issue bonds on behalf of the City for the financing of projects as defined by The State of Texas Economic Development Act, Class “B”. Projects and expenditures must be voted on, and if approved, be submitted to the Lone Star City Council for review and approval. All expenditures by the EDC **MUST** be reviewed and approved by the City Council prior to expenditure of any monies collected. Projects include but are not limited to; promotion of amateur athletics and sports including stadiums, ball parks, projects related to entertainment, conventions, auditoriums, tourist and exhibition facilities, amphitheaters, concert halls, and public parks, park facilities and events, open space improvements, municipal buildings, education facilities, and facilities for use

by institutions of higher education, and related roads, streets and water sewer facilities, and projects to promote new or expanded business enterprises, including facilities to promote job creation, retention, job training facilities, streets and roads, drainage, and related improvements, demolition of existing structures and general improvements that are related to any of the above projects and any other project that the board determines will promote new or expanded business enterprises, and the maintenance and operations expenses for any of the above described projects. , and projects to promote new or expanded business enterprises, including facilities to promote job creation, retention, job training facilities, streets and roads, drainage, and related improvements, demolition of existing structures and general improvements that are related to any of the above.
